Adesegun Olayiwola FATUSI is a Nigerian community physician, public health specialist, researcher and policy actor with over two decades of experience in the field of Sexual, Reproductive, Maternal and Adolescent Health (SRMAH). His core competencies include research, evidence-based programme development, policy development and advocacy, and evaluation. His experience cuts across the international development field, the academia and research organisation, and the civil society space at both national and international levels. Among others, he has previously worked with the Guttmacher Institute, New York, USA as a Director of International Research, and with the Nigerian programme of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) as Reproductive Health Advisor for state and national level projects (1996 to 2001). Within the academia, he previously served at the Obafemi Awolowo University (OAU) as Provost of the College of Health Sciences; Director of the Institute of Public Health; Director of the Population and Reproductive Health Programme; and Head (Chair), Department of Community Health. He is the President of the Academy for Health Development (AHEAD) – an indigenous Nigerian not-for-profit research and knowledge management and health development organisation. He has served as a consultant to several national and sub-national government agencies, multicountry research work, as well as international development organisations, including WHO, UNFPA, UNICEF, UNDP, UNAIDS, World Bank, USAID, and DfID-funded projects. He is currently a member of the Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health Technical Advisory Group (TAG) for the African Regional Office of the World Health Organization. He is currently leading the COVID-19 response in Ondo State, Nigeria, as the Chair of the State Inter-ministerial Committee on the Control of COVID-19.

He brings his strong academic background to bear positively on evidence-based field-based public health practice and knowledge translation. Among others, he previously authored the “Nigeria Country Assessment 2016: A human rights-based, equity-focused, gender-sensitive and sexual and reproductive health-focused country analysis of women and young people” for UNFPA Nigeria office, the “Reproductive Rights” section of the State of Nigeria’s Population; and several sections of UNICEF’s “Situation Assessment and Analysis of Women and Children in Nigeria” (as well as served as the Technical Editor for the last). He has served as the Lead Consultant for several national studies, including the National Study on School Health; National HIV/AIDS Knowledge, Attitude and Practices and School Health Survey; National AIDS and Reproductive Health Survey; National Obstetrics Care Study; Performance Factor Special Study on Reproductive and Child Health; and, National TB Quality of Care Study. He also served as Nigeria Team Lead/Principal Investigator for several multi-country studies, including the formative research for the Global Accelerated Action for the Health of Adolescents (AA-HA!) framework and the Global Early Adolescent Study (GEAS). He served as the foundation Principal Investigator for the Nigerian aspect of the 3-country, 3-year longitudinal “Starting Right at Schools” (StaRS) project funded by IDRC, Canada, and focusing on gender, reproductive health and water and sanitation in school settings and among school-attending adolescents. He has authored over a 100 peer-reviewed articles, mostly focused on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) and Rights field, including those on adolescent SRH, HIV/AIDS, sexually transmitted infections, family planning, abortion, maternal health, and gender-based violence, and male sexual health. He has also authored articles on other areas of public health including nutrition among children and adolescents, tuberculosis, and COVID-19 response.

He is highly experienced in the evaluation of health and development projects. His experience include the mid-term assessment of the Nigerian component of the EU-UN Spotlight Initiative addressing violence against women; evaluation of a past UNFPA country programmes; evaluation of the Final Evaluation of USAID-Funded AIDSTAR-ONE/Nigeria, and evaluation of the USAID-supported Orphan and Vulnerable Children Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting (OVC MER) in 6 states. He served as a Senior Research Consultant with the Family Planning Country Action Process Evaluation (FP CAPE) team, Carolina Population Center, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill for the mid-term evaluation of the Nigerian Urban Reproductive

Health Initiative 2 (NURHI 2). He was also the Lead Consultant for the endline evaluation of the “Engaging Civil Society Organizations to reverse the negative impact of COVID-19 on equal access to essential health services” (CSOE) Project - a component of the “One UN Response Plan to COVID-19 in Nigeria” project implemented by UNFPA between June 2020 and May 2021.

He was the foundation Course Director for the bi-annual International Certificate Training in Monitoring & Evaluation initiated by OAU & USAID/ MEASURE Evaluation (2011-2014) and the annual Health System Leadership and Management Course organised by OAU and USAID/Management Sciences for Health (2014 - 2017). He is also a seasoned trainer/facilitator and curriculum development expert. He was the foundation Director for the annual “Adolescent Health in sub-Saharan Africa” short course and OAU’s “International Workshop on Monitoring and Evaluation of Public Health Programmes”. He led the development of Ghana’s modular course in adolescent sexual and reproductive health in 2016. He also serves as a facilitator for the annual “Short Course on Adolescent Health in Low and Middle-Income Countries” hosted by the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and WHO since 2011.

He has served as the lead consultant for the development of several national policy documents in the areas of Sexual and Reproductive Health, including National Policy on the Health & Development of Adolescent and Young Persons (2005/2006 and 2018/19 versions), National Behaviour Change Communication Strategic Framework for HIV/AIDS (in 2003), Revised National Reproductive Health Policy (in 2009/10), National Policy on HIV/AIDS 2010-2015 (in 2009), National Strategic Framework on HIV/AIDS (2010-2015 and 2017-2021 versions), Integrated National Reproductive, Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health (RMNCAH) + Nutrition Strategy (in 2016), and the National RMNCAH Quality of Care Strategy (2017 -2018), and the National Youth Policy (2017-2019). He was a member of the team of experts that developed Nigeria’s Health Sector Reform Programme in 2004, the extant National Population Policy and National Health Policy. He also led the development of Namibia’s National Strategy for Women’s, Children’s and Adolescents’ Health in 2018.

Furthermore, he has served as the lead technical expert for the development of several national adolescent health documents. These include Nigeria’s national adolescent health training manuals (in 2001 and 2011/2012), National Action Plan for Advancing the Health of Adolescents in Nigeria (in 2010), National Guidelines for the integration of Adolescent and Youth Friendly Services into Primary Health Care facilities in Nigeria (in 2013), National Guidelines on Promoting Access of Young people to Adolescent- and Youth-Friendly Services in Primary Health Care Facilities in Nigeria (2013), and the National Standards and Minimum Service Package for Adolescent and Youth-Friendly Health Services in Nigeria (2013, 2018). He was also a lead resource person for the development of the 1<sup>st</sup> National Training Manual Reproductive Health (RH) Services (in 2001), Clinical Service Protocol and Standards of Practice for Family Planning/RH (in 2002), the Technical Implementation Documents for the Women & Child-Friendly Health Services in Nigeria (in 2004), the Road Map for Accelerating the Attainment of the Millennium Development Goals related to Maternal and Newborn Health in Nigeria (in 2005), and the National Minimum Package on SRH (in 2006). He led the development of the “Investment Case for Adolescents and Young People in Nigeria” and the National Condom Strategy Operational Plan 2021-2015 between 2020 and 2021.

He graduated from OAU with Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery degree, and distinction in Community Health and the Lawrence Omole Award for the best student in Community Health (1987). In 1992, he won the Federal Government of Nigeria award for the best candidate in the Part I examinations of the Faculty of Public Health, National Postgraduate Medical College. He graduated from the International Masters of Public Health programme of the Hebrew University, Hadassah, Israel, in 1995 with *summa cum laude* honours and obtained the Fellowship of the West African College of Physicians in Community Health in April 1995. He was a Population Leadership Fellow at the University of Washington, Seattle, USA between 2001 and 2002 and a Visiting Scholar at the Gates Institute, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, USA in 2007.
